January 2022 Status: In January, we sterilized 1,405 cats and placed 214 cats into loving forever homes.




February is National Spay/Neuter Awareness Month! **This month is dedicated to increasing awareness of the importance of spay/neuter.** There are many reasons to spay/neuter companion animals, but the most important reason is to reduce the overpopulation of companion animals.

According to the North Shore Animal League, "Cats are 45 times as prolific, and dogs 15 times as prolific, as humans. They do not need our help to expand their numbers; they need our help to reduce their numbers until there are good homes for them all." This is especially true for the unfortunate animals left to roam the streets, where each day is a struggle to survive, and the cycle of breeding continues.

At Forgotten Cats, we realize the importance of spay/neuter each and every day as we see the impact on the lives of homeless cats and kittens - malnutrition, infection, the effects of abuse and/or neglect, etc. This is why we work so hard at our mission of humanely reducing the homeless cat population and to stop the suffering of the thousands of kittens born to abandoned, homeless cats. Oftentimes, these cats and kittens end up in over-crowded shelters where they are euthanized.

We are thankful to have many wonderful and dedicated volunteers & supporters that are dedicated to this mission as well! So please, spread the word that spay/neuter works so that we can all work together to end the suffering of homeless

#### Maryland Spay & Neuter Grants



We would like to extend our deepest gratitude to the Maryland Department of Agriculture, Spay & Neuter Grants Program. In August of 2018 we received our very first grant from them to provide TNVR services in Maryland. Since then, we have TNVR'd over 3700 cats in Worcester & Wicomico Counties, Maryland! This program has significantly decreased intake and euthanasia at their local shelters and animal control. Many of these kitties are in forever homes as we write this, and others are still patiently waiting.





#### Option for February's Spotlighted Volunteer, Catherine Molineux

February's Volunteer Spotlight shines brightly on Trainer Clinic volunteer Catherine Molineux who has been a Forgotten Cats volunteer since November of 2019, and a Trainer volunteer since the Martin Luther King holiday in 2020. During most of the year, Catherine works at the Springfield Dairy Queen, and she volunteers on weekends (usually Sundays), but during the ice cream "off season" she is able to work additional shifts for Forgotten Cats during the week, which she says is "purrfect" for her!

Catherine said she originally filled out an online application to be a volunteer at the Brookhaven PetSmart and received a call about that job within a week. She started training almost immediately. After a couple of months, her volunteer trainer at Brookhaven shared information about additional openings at the Trainer Clinic – she thought Catherine's interests would lend themselves well to the duties at that location. Again, Catherine filled out the online volunteer application and again she received a call within a week – this time from Forgotten Cats' founder Felicia Cross. Catherine began her duties at the Trainer Clinic almost immediately!

February's Volunteer of the Month is Catherine

On site, a volunteer provided Catherine with a thorough job orientation for clean and feed duties. Catherine loves her duties but adds that her favorite part of the volunteer day is when she comes in at the start of her shift and greets all the cats and kittens waiting for her arrival. "I am an extremely diligent worker and dedicate my quality time to the cats by giving them love and support as well as talking and playing with them" says Catherine. "The most important thing is caring for the cats before doing any household tasks. It's my favorite part of being a Forgotten Cats volunteer. I play music on my iPhone to keep them calm, and I make sure they all get pets and hugs."

Dick Wolf, Trainer's Feed and Clean Volunteer Coordinator confirms that one of the special qualities of Catherine as a co-volunteer is her deep commitment to the animals. He describes her as a "super volunteer". Dick says Catherine always goes "above and beyond" what is expected of her. "She doesn't just do her job she does the job thoroughly and very well and stays at the facility until everything that needs to get done is done. She's a stickler for details, is conscientious and a valued asset." He goes on to say she works her weekend shifts, comes in midweek when needed, and fills in as a substitute on short notice. Catherine is a volunteer "extraordinaire" – not one he would ever want to lose.

Catherine says she first became closely involved with cats in July of 2012 when her husband, Lee was filming thunderstorms – a hobby of his. He heard a sweet meow coming from under the shed. A few days later a little kitten came out from hiding and rubbed against Catherine and Lee, marking them as hers. Catherine took the kitten to the vet. They determined that she was an abandoned stray

about 3 months old, so Catherine adopted her and named her Ginger. There are also three dogs in the Molineux family – a Sheltie named Patches and two Siberian Huskies named Chief and Misty.

When Catherine's husband, Lee isn't otherwise occupied he is busy working as a full-time manager of the family business, The Head Nut, at its main location in Ardmore. Catherine says Lee has worked there since he was a teenager. The Head Nut sells coffees, teas, spices, herbs, dry fruit, packed candies, different types of nuts, Asher's chocolate and white chocolate-covered pretzels, yogurt covered pretzels and more. The Head Nut has other locations such as the coffee warehouse in Yeadon, the Lancaster Farmer's Market in Wayne and a stand in the Reading Terminal!

Although Forgotten Cats is a big part of Catherine's life, that wasn't always the case. Catherine reflects back on the people and experiences that have been important to her, that she cherishes, and that have contributed to her being the individual she is today. She starts with her husband – to whom she has been married for more than 12 years – and is grateful for the love and support he provides to her and her furry family. Then she thinks back to her youth and fondly recalls being raised by her maternal grandmother who was her primary caregiver from birth through middle school, while her mother went to college and her dad worked. Her grandmother's influence continued as she taught Catherine to drive and closely followed Catherine's many high school activities, such as band, chorus, lacrosse, and participation in the National Art Honor Society.

After high school, Catherine went on to graduate in 2005 from Penn State University's Delaware County Campus with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Letters, Arts and Sciences with a minor in International Studies, and then went on to travel through Europe including visits to England, Ireland, France, Austria, the Czech Republic and Italy. She says that Italy was her favorite European country.

Catherine counts as friends many people with whom she has maintained relationships through Facebook, including former co-workers, high school friends, Forgotten Cats

volunteers, former professors, animal activists she has known and friends in general. She is especially appreciative of a long-time friend, Michael, who helps her and Lee with household chores, cooking and helping to take care of the dogs, especially Patches. Catherine enjoys doing crossword and Sudoku puzzles from the Sunday Inquirer, listening to classic rock music, and watching classic game shows and movies on television.

What's next for her? She said she is hoping to adopt another cat from Forgotten Cats. (Catherine, we think you'll be approved for that adoption in a heartbeat!)

Catherine, as much as you love working with and loving the Forgotten Cats kitties, Forgotten Cats loves having you as one of our dedicated volunteers – we are grateful for all you do, and are delighted that your work schedule gives you extra time during the winter months to devote to our kitties. ### **Vet Tech/Operations Manager**

We are looking for a **full-time**, **hands-on Vet Tech/Operations Manager** to manage the day-to-day operational needs in our Trainer, PA facility.

The Vet Tech/Operations Manager should possess

sufficient veterinary knowledge to devise medical treatment for routine illnesses and to implement more complicated treatment plans prescribed by our vets. S/he needs to have sufficient knowledge to assess whether the cats are responding to treatment and to respond appropriately. We provide medical treatment as needed for both cats who are deemed adoptable as well as feral cats who need extra medical care. The Vet Tech/Operations Manager should be knowledgeable, comfortable, and able to work safely with feral cats. The Vet Tech/Operations Manager will need to ensure that all supplies and medicines used during surgery and treatment are kept in stock.

difference in the lives of sick, injured, and/or frightened cats are immense.
