The shelter environment is very risky for kittens - they are so fragile they can easily succumb to disease, which

Volunteer Spotlight

Forgotten Cats' July Volunteer of the Month Attributes Her Success to Her Fellow Volunteers

This month's Forgotten Cats' Volunteer Spotlight shines brightly on the Glen Mills PetSmart Adoption Center Coordinator, Kelly Barretta. Kelly loves animals, especially cats, and came to Forgotten Cats by way of other animal volunteering she had done.

Kelly began as an Andy's Friends Cat Rescue volunteer in 2014 and grew to know all the employees and volunteers at the Glen Mills PetSmart. It was FC's Beth Allen, our barn cat coordinator who was transporting cats to/from the Glen Mills PetSmart who suggested to Kelly that she become a Forgotten Cats' volunteer. Because Kelly considers herself a "crazy cat lady" with 8 cats of her own, she thought the suggestion made sense and from that point on, she became a devoted FC volunteer.

Kelly quickly became an integral part of the Forgotten Cats Adoption Center at the Glen Mills PetSmart as the Center's Coordinator taking care of scheduling and handling day-to-day tasks, making sure the Center was being taken care of and the cats were happy. She works with the store managers to make sure everything is running smoothly and is the contact person for questions or concerns the volunteers at the Center may have.

Kelly says she has the best group of awesome volunteers at the Glen Mills Adoption Center. "Our volunteers are the main reason why I love doing this job – one that I couldn't do without their help."

Outside of being a devoted Forgotten Cats' volunteer, she adds that she's "a crazy lunch lady for Glenwood Elementary" – a job she has done for the past five years. "I absolutely love my job" she tells us but adds "it was really hard at first when we shut down for COVID without getting to say goodbye to the kids. Then upon returning to school we all were wearing the masks! Not being able to see the children's full faces made me sad. However, seeing how well they adapted to wearing their masks and how they just kept going was quite impressive!"


Kelly has three kids and a supportive husband, all who help with rescues! Her daughter, Molly, who is 20 now, began volunteering with Kelly when she was 14 and struggling with teen challenges. They had many meaningful talks during those years volunteering together at the Adoption Center. Her sons, Tanner and Luke have also been integral parts in cat rescue as they both have opened their bedrooms to foster cats and kittens through the years. "When Tanner moved into an apartment he took two of our kitties with him!" she tells us.

Kelly says her husband Steve's support includes allowing all these cats in their home! "With all the kittens and cats we have fostered, he has given these kitties love and affection and has also been understanding when I needed to run out and help with the Glen Mills Center or any cat-related situation."

Also part of Kelly's family are eight cats of her own, mostly foster fails. She has many stories about each one! Tigger, an orange tabby, is my "most special guy". He was adopted and returned a few times over the course of four years with Andy's Friends when finally Kelly felt so sad that he was returned again, she just adopted him herself!







The candidate will perform routine and emergency surgery, as well as provide wellness services and medical treatment within our facilities.

Since our inception in 2003, Forgotten Cats has sterilized and provided medical treatment for over 150,000 cats and kittens within our facilities. In addition, over 17,000 homeless cats and kittens were removed from the streets and given a second chance at life in loving forever homes through our adoption program.

Due to the high volume of sterilizations performed at our clinics, the candidate must have surgery experience, a willingness to learn, be able to function in a high-energy environment and enjoy working with cats. Salary is commensurate with experience.
